Treatment Team. The treatment team includes Nancy Thomas, James Dumesil, Marie Sherwood, trained staff, including our equine co-therapists. An important part of the treatment team is the horses. Most of the horses are Curly Horses that have puppy dog temperaments and are hypo-allergenic. This means that if you are usually allergic to a horse, you probably will not react to Curlies.

WHAT IS RADICAL ATTACHMENT CAMP?

Our camps are designed to help families to connect and help challenging children to redirect their paths. The focus of camp is to renew, recharge and empower each parent and child with effective techniques to increase love and laughter in their homes. Skill building interventions will be taught and practiced to build trust, honesty, self-control and conscience development. Most of us learn best with a hand on approach. Living the techniques and experiencing the change is the camp's goal. Families can then return home and continue to successfully improve relationships with their new skills. WILL THIS CAMP WORK FOR MY CHILD(REN)?

The Nancy Thomas Family Camps have been highly successful. This will be the third year that RADical Attachment Camp runs in Canada. We have the following psychobiological goals for the child: restore the natural hierarchy in the brain, create a physiological state that promotes healthy brain development through the modulation of emotion, enhance integrative functions, build, reorganize, and strengthen new brain circuitry through experience that generates new ways to thinking, feeling, and behaving. We help the child psychologically: regulate their emotions, promote acceptance of painful feelings, promote the direct expression of feelings in healthy attachment relationships, help the child to reduce symptomatic behavior, promote a unified identity by helping the child achieve a sense of cohesiveness about their own thoughts, feelings, and behaviors. We help the family to: learn that the child's behavior is part of an interactional process, change family patterns of communication, enhance attachment through closeness and connection, stay in charge of emphatic limit setting, use explicit communication that does not deny, distort, or disconfirm, encourage the child/family to accept all emotions, and discourage emotional contagion by enhancing personal boundaries.

We have cried together, rejoiced together, and problem solved together. We use only the best non-punitive techniques that take into consideration both the chronological age and the developmental age of the child.
